

Neurology
 Patients with CPEO use their frontalis muscles to lift their eyelids and show compensatory chin elevation.

Ophthalmology
 Hutchinson pupil is a fixed and dilated pupil caused by compression of the oculomotor nerve (CN III) as a result of uncal herniation.



Neurology
 involvement of the tip of the nose from facial herpes zoster. It implies involvement of the external nasal branch of the nasociliary nerve (branch of the ophthalmic division of the trigeminal nerve) and thus raises suspicion of involvement of the Eye.

Infectious Disease
 Hutchinson teeth are smaller and more widely spaced than normal and are notched on their biting surfaces. It is a sign of congenital syphilis



Dermatology
 Lentigo maligna, also known as Hutchinson freckle is the histopathological variant of melanoma in situ.



Dermatology
 Refers to pigmentation in the paronychia area suggesting subungual melanoma.
